

PASS/FAIL RESOLUTION

In order to encourage more students to take upper level classes, Juniors and Seniors may earn some credits on a "pass/fail" basis versus receiving a letter grade. A class that is declared "pass/fail" with the appropriate signatures and before the end of the 4th week of the semester will earn graduation credits but will not receive a letter grade and the course will not be calculated into a student's GPA.

Classes available for "pass/fail" are third and fourth Math/Science courses and upper level advanced courses that are not required courses. Administrative discretion will be reserved in approving "pass/fail" courses. After designating a class "pass/fail" a student may elect to take an earned grade rather than the "pass/fail" designation only if they inform the instructor four weeks before the end of the course. If the student elects to take the earned grade after designating "pass/fail," it will count as five credits of "pass/fail" designation.

A student may earn up to 20 credits on a "pass/fail" basis as long as the classes are taken during a student's Junior or Senior year and the "pass/fail" option is not used for more than two classes in the same semester.
